(Layboy's Lawrence Peterson caught up with Shaggy at the Daisy Hill Hilton just prior to the release of the new Scooby-Doo feature, *Scooby-Doo and the Haunted Haunted House*. We met with Hollywood's best-known dog lover, unshaven but agreeable, on a Friday afternoon just prior to the preview screening.)


L: Shaggy, let's talk about the Scooby-dooby-doo show.

S: (Groans) Shit, do we have to? That's all anybody wants to talk about in these interviews. I'll tell you something, I hate that scraggly mutt. A cold nose and a colder heart, that's all that mangy bag of fleas adds up to in my book.

L: Come now, Shaggy . . . you're talking about the 'scraggly mutt' that built your career. The dog that took you away from bit parts in After School Specials and made your name a household word.

S: "Shaggy"?

L: I believe it was Tom Wolfe who said of the 1970's,



"I can think of only two who made a difference: Shaggy, and Scooby. More than simply a boy and his dog, they were two stunning role models for a generation bent on losing themselves in the spooky, tumble-down haunted houses of a frightening decade."

S: Well, yeah. I guess we were that.

L: Let's talk about the dog. Scooby's reluctance to grant interviews is a continuing dilemma for the press, and for his fans even more so. Is Scooby a dog with a secret, a bowser with a skeleton in his closet?

S: Oh, Scooby's got quite a few bones in this closet (laughs). Well. About his not granting interviews, I don't know. I mean, he is a dog.

L: But there are exceptions. Offhand, I can recall a single interview (Kennel, v. 54, May 1972 — Ed.). It came out right after the release of the first seasons rushes. *Scooby-doo* was an untested commodity — nobody could have predicted its amazing success in the seasons that followed. In that interview, Scooby said of you "shffaggieee? yaffffch! scghaggy iff a goooood akchtor!"

S: And you ask me why he doesn't grant interviews. L: In the beginning, at least, your relationship with America's favorite hound was a good one. What happened? Why the tension that clouded later performances (such as the hesitant Scooby-Dooby-Doo and the Haunted Tavern) or the critically panned but surprisingly successful Scooby-Dooby-Doo and the Haunted Spook House, after which you actually left the set and refused to return to filming for a full season (late March '74).

S: Yeah, well, I don't know. There was a lot of pressure then, a lot of division within the cast. Steve (Steve Slater, leader of the troupe) kept pressing for a new format, for an all-out restructuring of the whole show . . . he kept on talking about a need to 'grow' and 'mature.' Eventually, we gave in just to get him to shut up — that was the beginning of Celebrity Scooby-Doo, which ran the two full seasons (summer '74-'75). I mean, Steve was real happy and all, meeting those famous people like Sandy Duncan and Laurel and Hardy and all that, but it really took its toll. L: How?

S: You look at those first shows — Scooby and the Haunted Restaurant, Scooby and the Haunted House of Mirrors — and there was a lot of live action. You know, falling down stairs, plunging through windows, running into walls, and so forth. And we all just kind of split it up, you know. 'Steve will run into this wall and




then Daphne will fall off the balcony into the chandelier and then Shaggy and Scoob will tumble into the cement mixer.' Like that. But by '75 — '74 even — that was right out. Steve, or even Daphne, would walk into the studio at eight that morning and say "Here's the thing. Shag and Scoob fall off the crane and make two big holes in the pavement. Shag and Scoob get run over by the Ghoul Man's phantom truck. Shag and Scoob get the shit scared out of them by the rotting mummy corpse hidden in the piano." And I'd be saying, "How about you, Steve? Gonna fall down a hidden chute or stumble onto a swinging door, maybe?" and he'd say, "No, I'll call the inspector." You get tired of that right away.


L: And yet, Scooby put up with it.

S: I have to give him credit there. Scoob was a real sport about the stunts. Still, it's different though. Remember that this is the *Scooby-Dooby-Doo* show we're talking about here, not the *Shaggy Fun Hour*. Scooby was getting tons of exposure with every pratfall. Scooby landed on me, not the other way around. Besides, he was hardly even coherent for a long stretch between '74 and '76; he was always hanging around with one bitch or another. Dogs, all of them. And the treats, too — the set was littered with Milkbone boxes, Flavo-Treats . . . and Scooby Snacks. He was real fiend for those. Still is. L: Let's talk about the other members of the cast.
