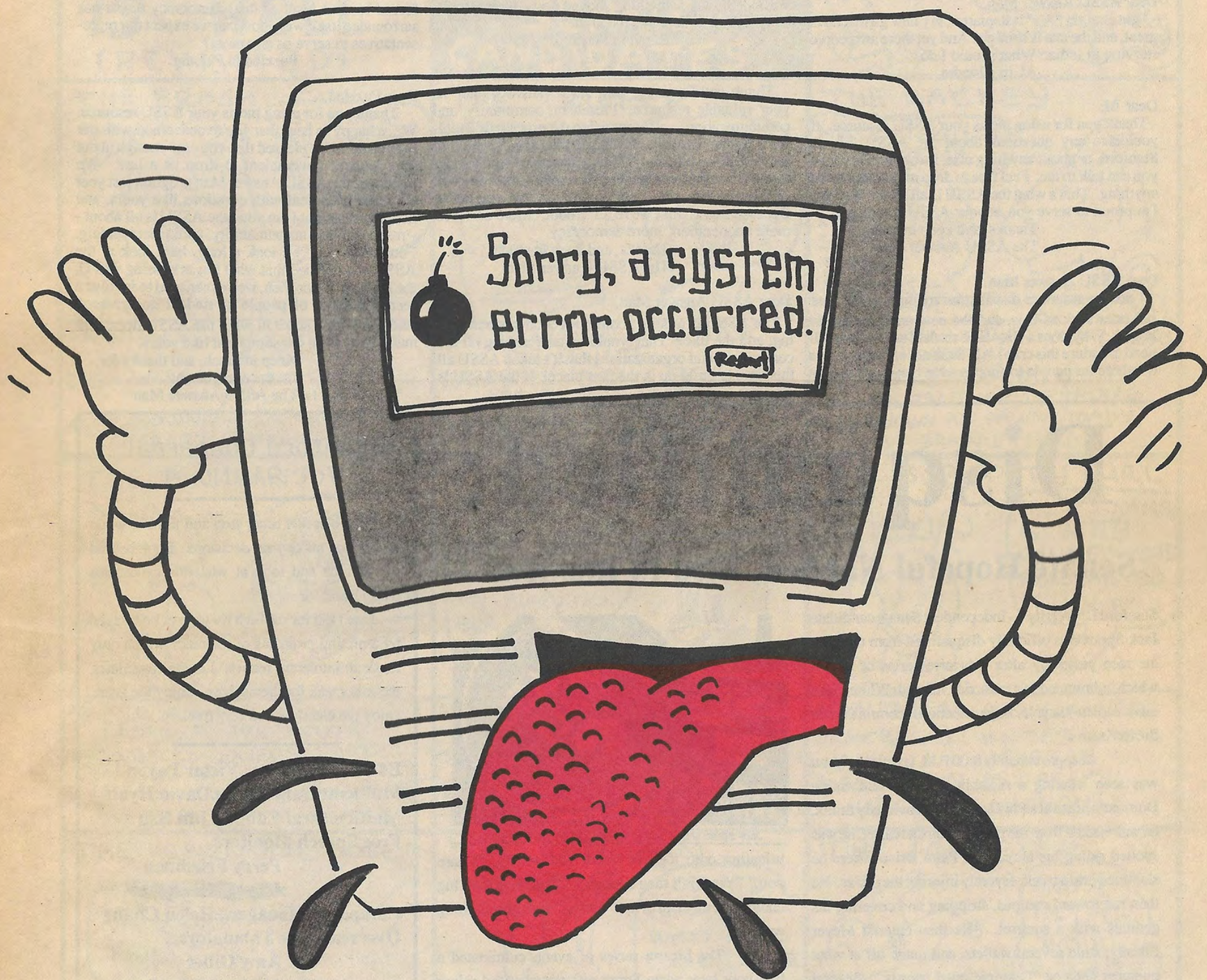

Disqualified:

Senate Hopeful Nabbed, Tied to Incident

Stanford University — Independent Senate candidate Jack Spratt was officially disqualified from the Senate race yesterday after a bizarre series of events which culminated in a nude ride through White Plaza on a stolen bicycle, says elections commissioner Steve Krauss.

At approximately 8:00 P.M. last night, Spratt was seen wearing a sealskin tank top and eating Domino's pizza at a Phi Delt party. Obviously drunk, he was ejected from the party. Soon thereafter, he was spotted riding his bicycle on Palm Drive where he slammed into a truck, severely injuring the driver. He then ran toward campus, stripping and covering his genitals with a squirrel. He then entered Meyer Library, stole several wallets, and made off at what pursuers deemed "Olympic-level speeds." Several students whose wallets were stolen by Spratt described his "general trustworthiness despite the fact that he was drunk, naked, and had a squirrel dangling from his groin."



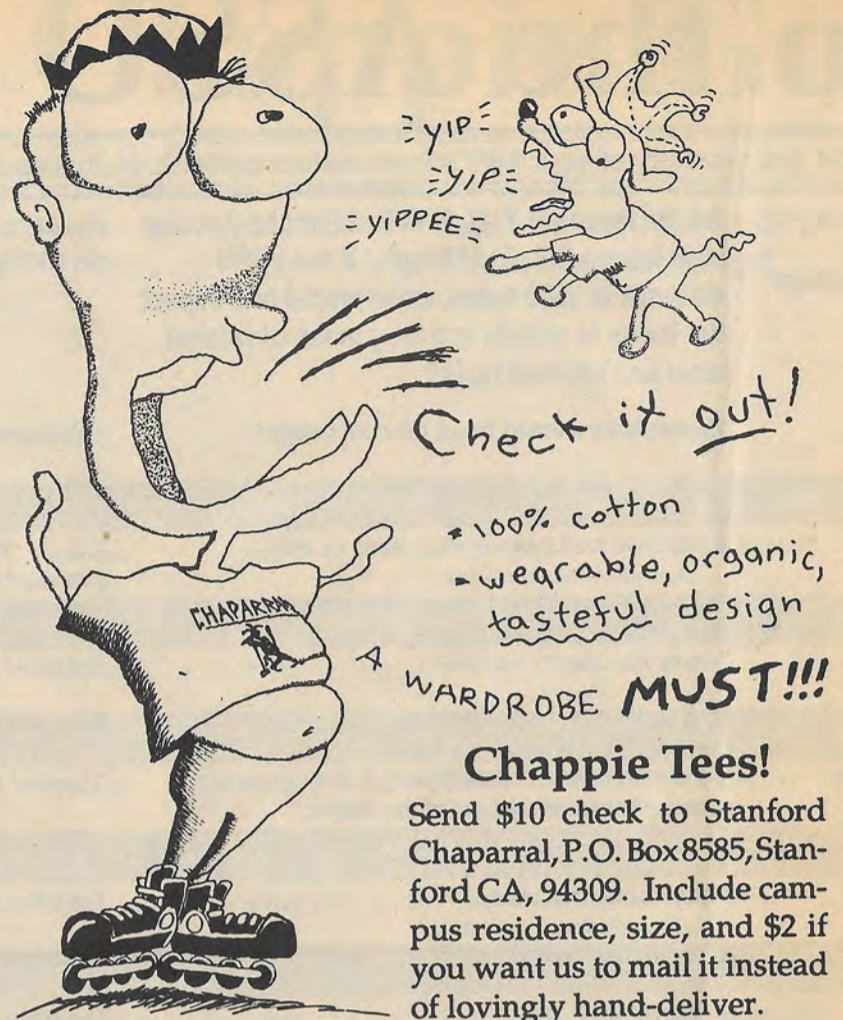

What is the Pub Board?

The Pub Board, short for Publications Board, is the organization which funds small and independent student publications (i.e., not the *Daily*). Many start-up publications or special publications come to the Pub Board for funding. The Pub Board supports a variety of publications, representing a wide variety of student views. If you've read *The Chaparral*, *Dialtone*, the Stanford Rape Awareness Project Survey, *Estos Tiempos*, or *Reasonable Doubt*, then you've read one

of the publications which got funding from the Pub Board. Oh, and we don't fund *Release*..

Why vote for a Pub Board increase?

Student publications represent differing voices from within the Stanford community. The expression of these voices is vital to the interchange of ideas on campus. Each year, there is an increase in the number of publications which request funding, but, unfortunately, the Pub Board has not received a funding increase in several years. Why? Because the

wording on the ballot is stupid. People will benignly vote "no increase" because it implies "no decrease." That's dumb. The Pub Board desperately needs a funding increase to match the growing demands and the rising cost of living increases.

Vote "increase" on the Pub Board fee request...because it would do the same for you if you were in its shoes.
